1. Forgiveness and Restoration Role-Play

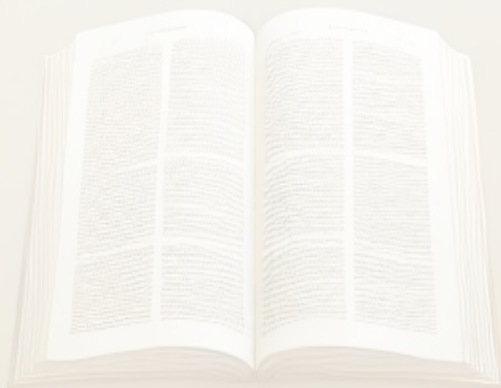
Objective: Practice demonstrating forgiveness and reconciliation in real-life scenarios.

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2. Transformative Gospel Tree Craft

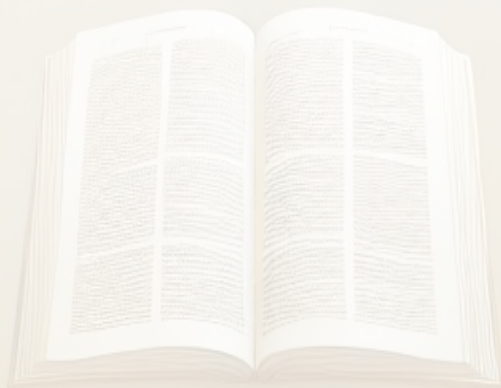
Objective: Create a visual representation of the transformative power of the gospel in relationships.

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3. Encouragement Letter Writing

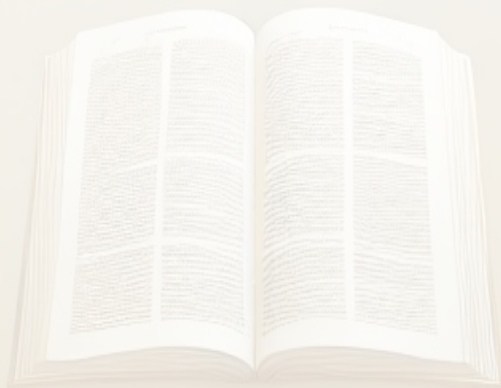
Objective: Reflect on the impact of encouraging words and their role in fostering reconciliation.

5. **Group Reflection:** After the letters are written, share thoughts about the process and what participants hope to achieve.



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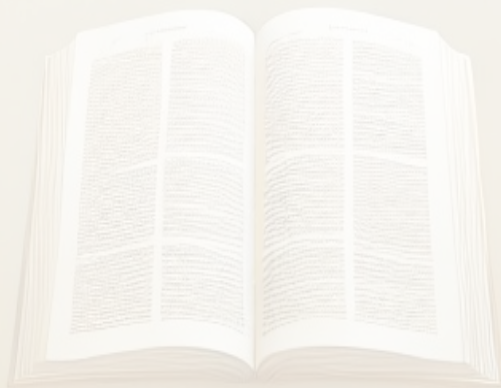
Section 2: Family Discussion and Prayer

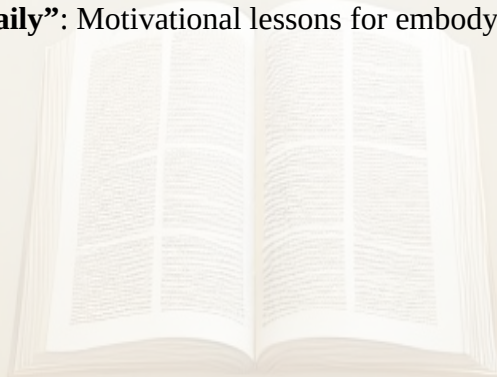
