

## The Seven Seals (Revelation 6:1-8:1)

---

### Introduction: The Unveiling of God's Judgment

In Revelation 6 to 8, the opening of the seven seals reveals a series of judgments that are poured out upon the earth. Each seal opened by the Lamb brings a new judgment or event, intensifying as the seals progress. These judgments include war, famine, death, cosmic upheaval, and the cries of the martyrs seeking justice. The seals culminate in a moment of profound silence in heaven, signaling the anticipation of the final act of God's wrath. Through these judgments, God's justice is declared, and the inhabitants of the earth are forced to reckon with the consequences of sin.

"Tonight's study is going to show us how God's justice unfolds in the last days," Ryan said. "The opening of the seals by Jesus reveals the judgments that will come upon the earth, but it also shows us God's righteous and inevitable plan for dealing with evil."

Ariel, always eager to understand how the book of Revelation fits into God's overall plan, asked, "Why are these judgments happening? Is God just angry?"

### Key Teachings: The Revelation of God's Justice through the Seals

---

#### 1. The First Four Seals: The Four Horsemen of the Apocalypse (Revelation 6:1-8)

##### Key Verses:

*"And I looked, and behold a white horse: and he that sat on him had a bow; and a crown was given unto him: and he went forth conquering, and to conquer." (6:2)*

- **The White Horse (Conquest):**

Ryan explained, "The first seal opens with the appearance of a rider on a white horse. This rider represents conquest and the spread of power and influence, often associated with false peace or domination. He is given authority to conquer, but it signifies the beginning of turmoil."

- **The Red Horse (War):**

- **The Black Horse (Famine):**

“The third rider rides a black horse and carries a pair of scales, symbolizing famine and economic hardship. When resources become scarce, famine follows, affecting food supplies and people's ability to survive.”

- **The Pale Horse (Death):**

“Finally, the fourth rider, on a pale horse, brings death and destruction. His name is Death, and Hades follows him, signifying widespread death due to disease, war, and famine. This seal speaks to the devastating consequences of sin and rebellion.”

Alice asked, “So these horses are like bad things happening all over the world?”

“Yes,” Ryan said, “each of these judgments brings terrible consequences. They represent the breakdown of peace and prosperity, and the world facing the repercussions of rejecting God.”

## 2. The Fifth Seal: The Cry of the Martyrs (Revelation 6:9-11)

### Key Verse:

But even in judgment, God’s sovereignty and justice are clear. The seventh seal tells us that God is about to bring everything to completion.”
